



Rosa is the only UK-wide fund for women and girls, with a mission to mobilise resources for women's rights and equality. Rosa is unique. While thousands of groups across the country work to support disadvantaged women, Rosa goes further. Rosa makes grants to support initiatives that benefit women and girls facing disadvantage, across four key areas:

- Leadership and representation
- Safety
- Health and wellbeing
- Economic justice

These four pillars underpin Rosa's work and the evidence makes a compelling case for change to tackle inequality and poverty faced by women and girls in the UK. Rosa supports work that others can't. Evidence shows that investing in women leads to better outcomes for everyone including better educated and healthier families, more prosperous and cohesive communities. Women are the backbone of local communities and they need your support to drive change. We can't achieve gender equality without strong, vibrant, vocal and connected women's organisations.

Through grants, we've already increased the impact and the influence of over 100 groups throughout the UK. We also provide beneficiaries with networking and training help connect the projects with each other to share learning, and champion their work so they can attract wider support. We draw evidence from grants to share lessons and influence change. An independent evaluation showed our work helped change the lives of over 26,000 women in the last 6 years alone – Rosa has reached thousands of groups across the country and your involvement in the Inspire Together mentoring programme will go further too. Inspire Together

Inspire Together is Rosa's dynamic mentoring programme that pairs professionals from the corporate and not for profit sector with women running grassroots groups and campaigns. This programme is an extension of our support for women's organisations and a wonderful opportunity to connect across sectors. Through this programme, Rosa is connecting individuals to share their experience. Working in a small organisation can be isolating, this programme aims to support women's charities to be better prepared to deliver their mission; help shape tomorrow's leaders and be more sustainable.

Those providing the mentoring will themselves be important beneficiaries. They will refine their existing skills, by sharing their knowledge and experience with women working at grassroots level, and develop new insight into the Women's sector as well as additional skills in communicating their technical expertise effectively.

What are we looking for

We are looking for individuals who are

- Advocates for gender equality
- Enthusiastic about offering their advice and expertise
- Willing to commit to one hour per month for a minimum of six months

We will match mentors with mentees based on your area of expertise and the support needs identified by the mentee. We are looking for people with experience and the confidence to share their knowledge of the following areas:

- Business Planning
- Communications
- Financial Management
- Fundraising
- Team Management/HR
- Leadership Development

The matching process will also take into account the kind of work you do and what you hope to gain from the experience. Let us know in the application form if you have a particular interest in a specific cause in the Women's sector or in one of Rosa's four key areas leadership & representation, safety, health & wellbeing or economic justice. Please ensure that your employers are happy for you to take part in the mentoring programme. As part of the application process, you will need to include details of a line manager who supports your involvement in the mentoring programme.
